# TIGER

Tigers belong to the Cat family, and have orange fur with black stripes. Tigers are apex predators and control the animal populations in their habitats.

The last sighting of a wild Malayan Tiger in Singapore was in 1930s. Now, there are less than 200 Malayan Tigers left in the wild due to habitat loss and illegal wildlife trade of its animal parts.

# OTTER

Otters are generally brown in colour. The two species found in Singapore are the Oriental Small-clawed Otter and the Smooth-coated Otter.

The coats of otters are thick to keep them warm in water. They prefer fish as food and are at risk of human-wildlife conflict and pet trade.

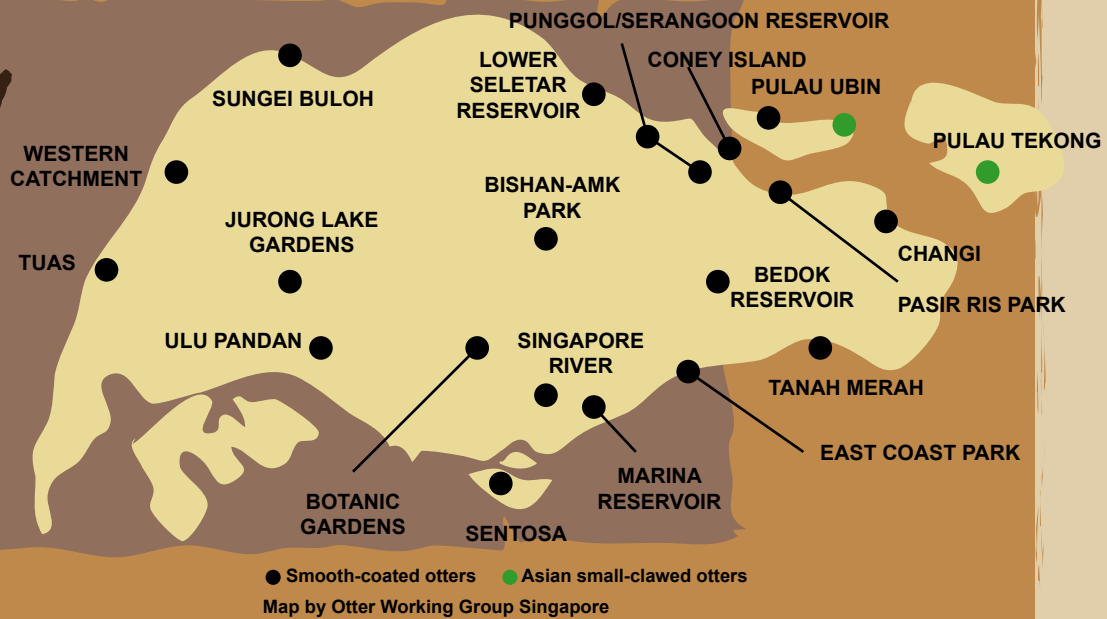

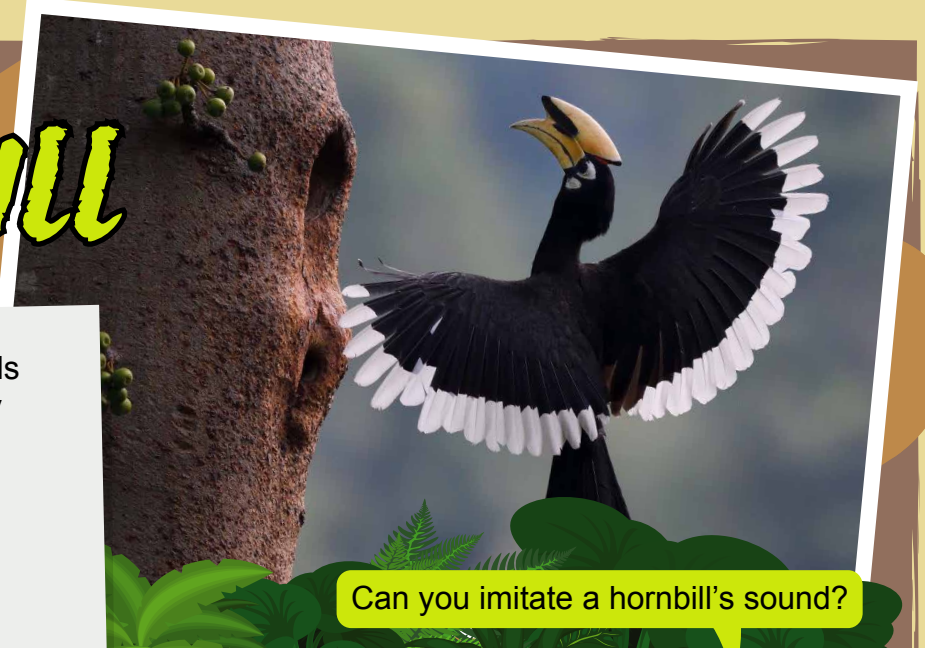

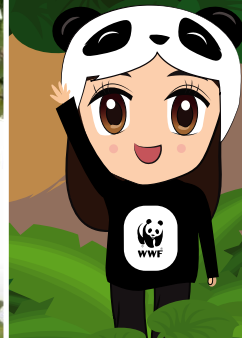
# HORNBILL

The Oriental-pied Hornbill was believed to be locally extinct until late 1990s, where one pair was rediscovered and successfully conserved.

Hornbills are black and white, with a light yellow beak and a wingspan of about one metre. They play a crucial role in the spread and germination of the seeds in forests.

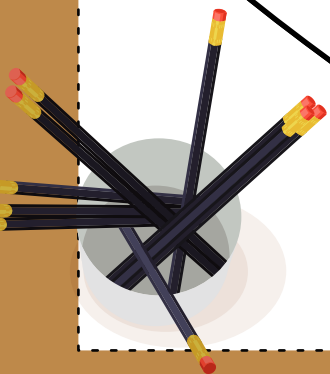
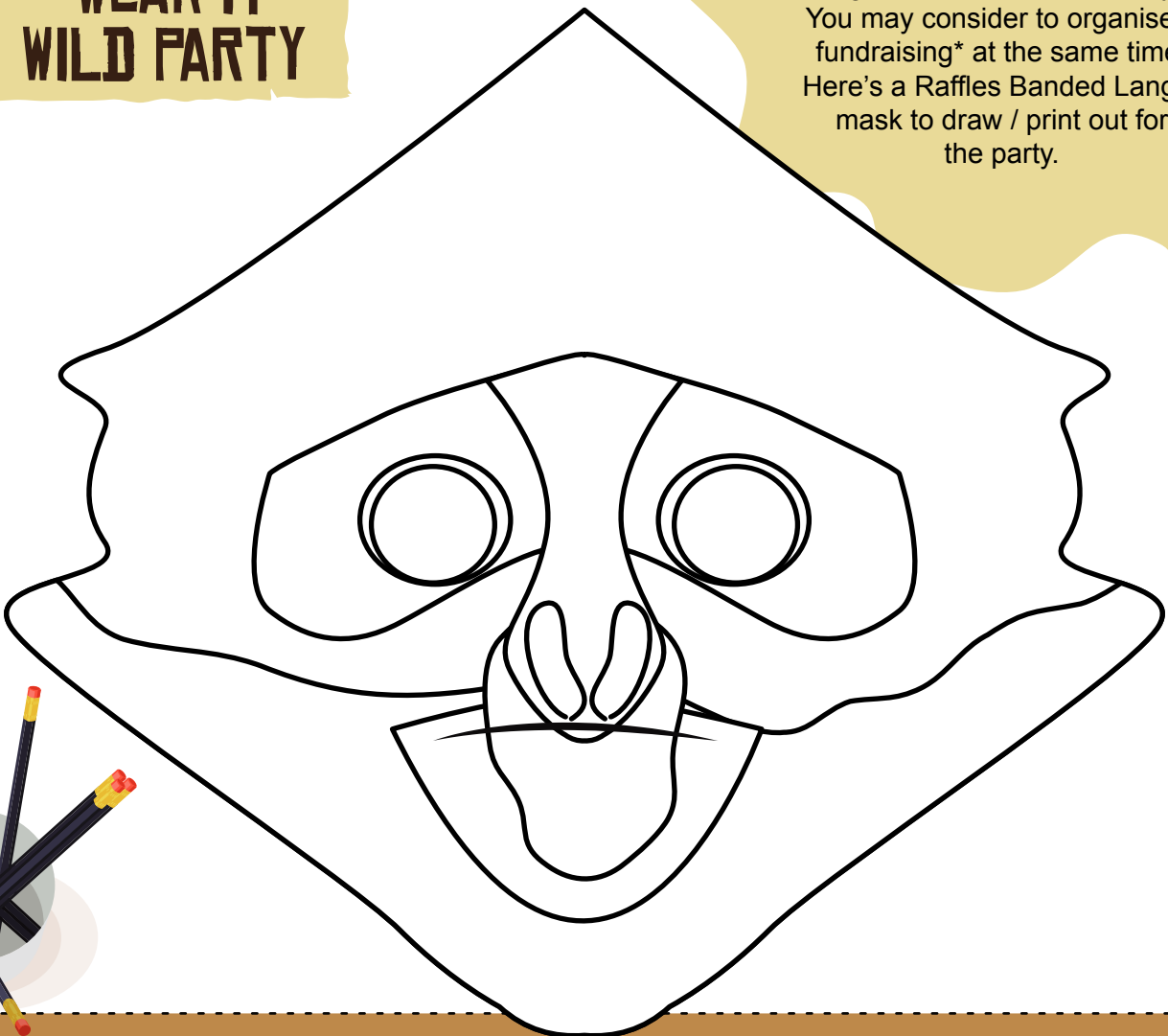
